### 6-month exam completion deadline

MCQ Examinations are now available to be taken remotely and via Prometric test centres. Candidates must complete and be successful in their MCQ and OSCE within 6 months of completing their training programme. Candidates who do not/cannot complete their examination in this timeframe, must contact their training provider to obtain further training prior to applying for exams.

#### Exam Viewing sessions

In accordance with Government restrictions, we are now conducting exam viewing appointments.

### Attendance at Exams

In line with government and HSE guidelines, if you are displaying any symptoms of COVID-19 or answer yes to any of the questions (listed below) please do not attend your appointment.

- have you had symptoms of cough, fever, high temperature sore throat, runny nose or flu like symptoms now or in the last 14 days?

- have you been confirmed or suspected of having Covid-19 in the last 14 days?

- have you been in contact with a person who has been confirmed or suspected of having Covid-19 in the last 14 days?
- have you been advised to self-isolate by a doctor?
  have you been advised to cocoon by a doctor?

You will be asked these questions again when you arrive in the PHECC for your appointment.

#### 2021 CPGs

PHECC wish to advise you that all examinations will be now conducted under 2021 CPGs which impacts on examinations. Candidates must complete their training under the most current version of CPGs in order to be eligible to attend their examination.

Please be advised of the following dates of examinations and which CPG version will be examined.

From January 1<sup>st</sup> 2022 – all exams will be on 2021 CPGs.

Please also be advised, that if a candidate completes an MCQ on 2017 CPGs, they must show proof of completing a CPG upskilling course with their RI before they can attempt an OSCE on 2021 CPGs (the 6 months rule stating that candidates must successfully complete all components of the NQEMT examination within 6 months of completing their training programme applies).
